Encouragement

There are a lot of things about Olympic athletes that are fascinating—their training regimens, sacrifices, habits, equipment, coaches . . . not to mention their awesome performances. We watch and listen carefully to observe how they conduct themselves. It’s revealing and informative. Many of the practices world class athletes adopt give us clues about how to perform like champions in our own activities.

Maybe you noticed it during the recent Winter Olympic games. The guys who “talk” the skiers into their start. I first noticed it in the Men’s Giant Slalom. As Ted Ligety prepared to start his run, there were a few guys there who were paid to say encouraging things to him before he jumped out of the starting gate. I have learned that the words and style of their encouragement are specially designed for the particular skier in the starting gate at the time. No “one size fits all” encouragement, but special words just for this athlete.

We know words are important. A gruff word can wound. A loving word can help and heal. A warning word can protect.

Apparently words are so important to Olympic skiers that they pay people to shout certain words of encouragement in certain ways to them before they perform.

The words we hear certainly influence our action. Be mindful of the words and influences with which you surround yourself-- others who speak kind, encouraging, and loving words and the words of God found in the Scriptures.

There is no doubt that the words we say influence others in powerful ways. Be mindful of what you communicate with others. Not only the words, but the way they are said. Remember that

eighty percent of what we communicate is nonverbal.

As I’ve heard Ken Callahan say many times, “Positive reinforcement yields more productive results any day than negative reinforcement yields every day.”

**Be careful with the words
you say to others.**

It will help us to encourage others if we remember the “three simple rules,” Bishop Rueben Job’s summary of John Wesley’s General Rules: Do no harm; do good; stay in love with God. They are encouraging imperatives.

The Bible clearly tells us what to do in 1 Thessalonians 5:11 (NRSV), “Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.”

Imitate Jesus. Be an encourager. Ponder and pray about the words you use to encourage those around you. You never know. You may be saying the last words someone hears before they lay down a championship run!

Go in peace. Go with God. And be well.

Rejuvenate is:

An educational program for clergy and laity that focuses on financial management and planning and stewardship education. Rejuvenate includes an economic initiative for clergy.

The economic initiative for clergy consists of **four grants**:

- 1. Clergy Education Debt Reduction Grant** – a matching grant that will assist clergy in reducing and/or eliminating their education debt (clergy will identify congregation matching funds)
- 2. Retirement Fund Incentive Grant** - a grant that will pay \$1,000 to 400 clergy per year to make first time personal contributions to the UM Personal Investment Plan (Rejuvenate will identify matching funds)
- 3. Family Emergency Fund Grant** – Rejuvenate will match up to \$1,000 clergy contributions to an Emergency Fund for the duration of the project (Rejuvenate will identify matching funds)
- 4. Called Anew Fund Grant** – a matching fund grant overseen by Bishop Coyner and the Cabinet to assist clergy in transitioning from their pastoral appointment (Rejuvenate will identify matching funds)
